

Readings at Mass for the Baptism of the Lord (Year A)

FIRST READING

A reading from the Prophet, Isaiah

Thus says the Lord, 'Behold my servant, whom I uphold: my chosen, in whom my soul delights. I have put my Spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench: he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not faint or be discouraged, 'till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law.'

I am the Lord; I have called you in righteousness: I will take you by the hand and keep you. I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations - to open the eyes that are blind; to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said, 'Truly, I understand that God shows no partiality, but, in every nation, anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ - he is Lord of all - you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judaea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good, and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.'
